



## **Small Group Questions from March 09, 2025**

### **Sermon: Ongoing Nehemiah 13:1-31**

1. If and when a person confronts you about sin, do you tend to become angry and defensive, or do you repent out of humility and gratitude for the correction?
2. If you have sin, how does not being confronted about it impact you?
3. When was the last time you confronted a brother or sister in Christ concerning their sin?
4. How is confronting a brother's or sister's sin actually gracious and helpful?
5. Based on how YOU respond/react to the ways others confronts you, how do you think you should go about confronting another person?
6. Consider your body a temple of the living God. Now, are there any "Ammonites" that have taken up residence in the chambers of the temple (you)? How do you (we) set our minds on the flesh?
7. Why does God want the church to confront known, habitual sin in the church, as described in Matthew 18:15-18? (Remember, the question is not how, but why.)
8. What has the Lord taught you through this brief study of Ezra & Nehemiah?
